ORDER

WHEREAS Ordinance 1 deals with grace marks for passing in each exam of passing, Ordinance 2 deals with grace marks for getting higher marks, Ordinance 3 deals with grace marks for getting distinction in the subject only and Ordinance 4 deals with condonation of marks;

AND WHEREAS the report of the Committee appointed under the chairmanship of Dr. N.S. Umrani, Pro-Vice-Chancellor of the University for proposing modifications in the above said Ordinances 1 to 4 has been accepted by the Board of Examinations and Evaluations in its meeting held on 6.2.2018 and the same has been recommended by the Board of Examinations and Evaluation to the Board of Deans for consideration and further necessary action;

AND WHEREAS as per Section 37(1)(q) of the Maharashtra Public Universities Act, 2016, the Board of Deans in its meeting held on 12.5.2018 prepared a draft of amended Ordinances 1 to 4 after taking into consideration the changes proposed by the Committee in its above said report and accepted by the Board of Examinations and Evaluation;


AND WHEREAS the said amended Ordinances 1 to 4 are required to be made applicable to the examinations conducted from the academic year 2018-19 and onwards;

AND WHEREAS it will take some time till the Ordinances 1 to 4 are placed before the appropriate authorities for approval and amended as per the provisions of Section 74 of the Maharashtra Public Universities Act, 2016;

THEREFORE, I, Prof. (Dr.) Nitin R. Karmalkar, Vice-Chancellor of the Savitribai Phule Pune University, by and under the powers vested in me under Sub-Section (8) of Section 12 of the Maharashtra Public Universities Act, 2016, hereby issue the following directives:

- (1) Amended Ordinances 1, 2 and 4 shall be as mentioned in the Annexure.
- (2) Ordinance 3 shall stand repealed.
- (3) Amended Ordinances 1, 2 and 4 shall be made applicable to the examinations conducted from the academic year 2018-19 and onwards.

This Order shall remain in force till the amended Ordinances 1 to 4 come into force.

AMENDED ORDINANCE 1

GRACE MARKS FOR PASSING IN EACH OF HEAD OF PASSING (THEORY/ PRACTICAL/ ORAL/ SESSIONAL / ANY ASSESSMENT HEAD ADDED FOR EVALUATION DURING THE TERM OR AT END OF TERM)- (EXTERNAL/INTERNAL)

The examinee shall be given the benefit of grace marks in External and Internal examinations, only for passing in each head of passing or sub-head of passing where multiple sub-heads are required to be passed under one head of passing.

The benefit of grace marks shall be given as follows:

Head of Passing	Grace Marks up to
Up to -50	2
51 - 100	3
101 - 150	4
151 - 200	5
201 - 250	6
251 - 300	7
301 - 350	8
351 - 400	9
And 401 & above	10

Provided that benefit of such gracing marks given in different heads of passing shall not exceed 1% of the aggregate marks in that examination.

Provided further that benefit of such grace marks shall not be given for passing in aggregate head of passing.

Provided that benefits of above mentioned grace marks shall not be given if the candidate fails to secure necessary passing marks in the aggregate head of passing also, if prescribed in the examination concerned:

Provided further that benefits of above mentioned grace marks shall be given to the candidate for such examinations only for which provision of award of class or GPA or grade has been prescribed:

Provided further that this gracing is concurrent with the rules and guidelines of professional statutory bodies concerned.

AMENDED ORDINANCE 4

GRACE MARKS FOR PASSING WHERE CANDIDATE FAILS IN ONLY ONE HEAD OF PASSING

- (1) If a candidate fails in only one sub-head of passing or head of passing, having passed in all other sub-heads of passing or heads of passing, as the case may be, and if he fails to secure necessary passing marks in that sub-head of passing or head of passing after giving grace marks to the maximum limit permissible under Amended Ordinance 1, he shall be given the benefit of grace marks only for passing in that head of passing including sub-heads of it, (Theory/Practical/ Oral/Sessional) in External or Internal examinations, up to 1% of the aggregate marks of the examination or 10% of the total number of marks of that head of passing, in which he is failing, whichever is less.
- (2) If a candidate fails in aggregate head of passing, having passed in all sub-heads of passing and heads of passing, he shall be given the benefit of grace marks for passing in the aggregate head of passing up to 1% of the aggregate marks of the examination.
- (3) Such grace marks whether in one sub-head of passing or head of passing or aggregate head of passing, shall be restricted to maximum up to 10 marks only.
- (4) Total marks in the subject after giving benefit of grace marks in that sub-head of passing or head of passing or aggregate head of passing, shall be shown in the Statement of Marks.
- (5) A candidate shall be entitled to get the benefit of Ordinance 140-A along with Amended Ordinance 4.
- (6) This gracing of marks is concurrent with the rules and guidelines of professional statutory bodies concerned.

NOTES FOR AMENDED ORDINANCES 1, 2 AND 4:

- (1) If a candidate fails in a sub-head of passing or head of passing of the same subject, he shall be entitled to the benefit of the grace marks in all such heads, if necessary, subject to the maximum limit of grace marks permissible.
- (2) The Class/GPA/Grade in the examination concerned of the candidate, shall be declared on the aggregate marks of the candidate in the examination, after getting benefit of grace marks under the Amended Ordinance.

(3) Benefits of above mentioned Amended Ordinances may be given to the candidates appearing in the examination with backlog and/or exemption whenever such an exemption or system of backlog has been provided.

(4) Benefits under above mentioned Amended Ordinances shall be given in every examination of the course.

(5) Sequence of Application of Amended Ordinance:

(i) In the performance of the candidate, marks/credits, if any, secured by him for carrying out the activities prescribed by the University under Ordinance 163 or under any other rule, shall be added in the marks of the sub-head/s of passing or head/s of passing or aggregate head of passing in which he has failed.

(ii) If after addition of such marks, if any, under Sub-Clause (i) above, the candidate fails to secure necessary passing marks, the benefit of grace marks under Amended Ordinance 1 shall be given up to the maximum limit permissible for passing in such sub-head/s of passing or head/s of passing. Benefit of grace marks under Amended Ordinance 1 shall not be given for passing in aggregate head of passing.

(iii) If a candidate fails in only one sub-head of passing or head of passing and if he fails to secure necessary passing marks in that sub-head of passing or head of passing after giving grace marks to the maximum limit permissible under Amended Ordinance 1, he shall be given the benefit of grace marks under Amended Ordinance 4.

(iv) If a candidate fails in aggregate head of passing, having passed in all sub-heads of passing and heads of passing, he shall be given the benefit of grace marks under Amended Ordinance 4 for passing in the aggregate head of passing to the maximum limit permissible under Amended Ordinance 4.

(6) Definitions:

(i) Aggregate Head of Passing: Aggregate head of passing includes all sub-head/s of passing and head/s of passing which are required to be passed either separately or conjointly, for passing any particular semester or year, as the case may be, of any course.

(ii) Examination: Examination includes test conducted during or at end of a semester or year of a course for which mark statement is issued by college / University as the case may be.

(iii) Head of Passing: Head of Passing includes Theory / Practical / Oral / Sessional / Sessional-Viva / Seminar / Project Work / Dissertation or any other assessment head added for evaluation of any subject of a course.

(iv) Semester: Semester is a part of duration of a course, in which activity of teaching-learning followed by examination and evaluation is carried out and results are declared by awarding class/grade.

(v) Sub-head of Passing: Sub-head of passing means a separate head of passing which is required to be passed either separately or conjointly with other sub-head or head of passing, and is included in the head of passing.

(vi) Total marks of the Subject: Total marks of the subject means marks obtained + marks awarded under Ordinance 163 for carrying out the activity prescribed under Ordinance

163 or any other rule (if any) + grace marks either under Amended Ordinance 1 or under Amended Ordinance 4, as the case may be.
